

# '10 Missions Packing List: cross them off as you pack them

**ONE SUITCASE (less than 50 pounds)** – there is a charge (\$50) for extra weight  
**ONE CARRY-ON BAG (CAN FIT UNDER YOUR SEAT or OVERHEAD COMPARTMENT)**

**Carry-on:** 45 linear inches or 115 cm (L+W+H) – go to their website regarding bringing liquids. The maximum weight of the carry-on bag is 40 pounds (go to [www.continental.com](http://www.continental.com) )

## **WHAT DO I HAVE TO BRING:**

### **1. BIBLE - MANDATORY**

2. We are sleeping in bunk beds. Bring a pillow and a sheet, maybe a fitted sheet for a twin mattress.

**3. Toiletry items - TIP - Buy the SMALL sample size bottles/containers of toiletry items** – 1 week supply, takes up less room in your suitcase, saves you \$. Conditions similar to “camping” – no electric in the bathrooms

- Deodorant/ shampoo
- Soap
- Sun screen
- Toothbrush/Toothpaste
- **Water bottle with name on it**
- Towels (2-3)
- Sunglasses

### **4. Clothes: (MODESTY)**

**The morning of the trip (and on the way home):** wear missions t-shirt with jeans or pants.

- Missions t-shirts (2) provided for you
- ALL – jeans and/or slacks (no “skinny jeans”; not tight fitting, but not baggy; guys may need a belt – no droopy pants/shorts; wear at services and skits)
- Jacket and/or sweatshirt(s)
- Socks
- T-shirts to get dirty in (no tank tops); great to have Christian t-shirts
- Underwear
- MODEST, Warm sleep wear (it may get cool at night)
- Shorts you can wear at the ranch – not for out when we are doing services (NO SHORT SHORTS, no writing on the back side)
- Baseball hat, hat, or Bandana (keep sun off your face)
- MODEST swimsuit (girls, one piece or be ready to wear a dark t-shirt with suit)
- comfortable shoes/sneakers; also flip-flops or cros to go to the bathroom or shower building

## **Other items not mandatory, but good ideas:**

- \* Cough drops or Vitamin C drops (Vicks)
- \* Camera (maybe best to have disposable ones)
- \* Sanitized hand lotion
- \* Ear plugs (in case you are in the room with someone who snores)
- \* Garbage bag (for dirty clothes in suitcase)
- \* Old shoes – you don’t mind getting dirty
  
- \* Medication - example :  
Medicine/Medications you need to take daily (bring note with medicine) for Mrs. Schafe

## **OTHER REMINDERS**

**NO LAUNDRY FACILITIES ALL WEEK! HOWEVER, THERE IS A SINK AND WATER!**

**NO ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT OF ANY KIND - NO IPODS, MP3'S , CD PLAYERS, ETC**

**STUDENTS - NO CELL PHONES (which means NO CAMERAS THAT ARE ALSO CELL PHONES)**

- \* Do NOT bring jewelry (studs OK) -  
Leave best jewelry at home  
Leave best valuables at home
- NO NEW CLOTHES NEEDED** – this is a missions trip, not a fashion show

## **HOW MUCH MONEY TO THEY NEED FOR THE TRIP**

**CASH - make sure it is in SMALL BILLS - \$1'S, \$5'S AND \$10'S.**

**1. Offering for the missionary (if checks are sent, payable to Edwin Rivera);** he helps set-up the trip and takes us everywhere we go - without him, there may be no trip!

**2. Otherwise, they need money for:**

- March 31<sup>st</sup> and April 6<sup>th</sup> - food in airports, usually twice as expensive than outside the airport
- Lunch money for March 31<sup>st</sup> when we arrive in Corpus
- March 31<sup>st</sup> – money if they want to buy snacks when we go to Wal-Mart before we go to the ranch
- \$7 for April 5 trip to the USS Lexington – entire team going
- \* (optional) Souvenir money for the day that we go to the USS Lexington
